Disneyland Resort Paris, a family resort located in the Seine-et-Marne region of France is the perfect holiday destination for guests of all ages. Sitting on 1,943 hectares of land, the resort is about one-fifth the size of Paris itself, offers over 50 attractions and has hosted 185 million guests since it first opened in April 1992.

Although Disneyland Paris is famous for the Disneyland Park and the Walt Disney Studios Park theme park, this land of magic and adventure presents more than just thrills and fun rides for children. In addition to the theme parks, the resort boasts 7 Disney-themed hotels, 2 convention centres and France's largest entertainment complex outside of Paris: the Disney Village.

Guests of all ages and from all walks of life can find their niche in this spectacular family resort. Young girls will be fascinated by the 43m high Sleeping Beauty Castle and Alice's Curious Labyrinth. Young lads might be more interested in Space Mountains: Mission 2 or Pirates of the Caribbean. The whole family will certainly have an enjoyable time with Honey, I Shrank the Audience among other attractions. Children can also enjoy meals, autographs and photos with classic Disney characters like Mickey Mouse, Minnie Mouse, Winnie the Pooh and others.

In Disney Village, you can enjoy shopping at the Val d'Europe International Shopping Mall or pick up discounted designer labels at the nearby La Vallee Outlet Village. Professional and budding golfers can perfect their skills on the 27-hole Golf Disneyland which comes with a clubhouse, practice range, lakes and bunkers. The Disney Village flaunts a 15 screen Multiplex and an IMAX Theatre where movie fans can embark on a 3D movie experience. There's also a games arcade and a bowling alley in the village.

Nature enthusiasts or those seeking a bit of tranquillity can look forward to the 6-minute ride aboard the Panoramagique Balloon. This large hot-air balloon carries up to 30 passengers and floats over Lake Disney, offering a breathtaking view of the resort from 100meters above the

ground. Guests can also take part in various water activities on the Lake Disney or simply go for a stroll along the lake. The 450, 000 flowers planted every year and the 12,000 trees provide a stunning backdrop to the resort.

All these activities will surely make a guest tired and hungry, which is where the hotels and restaurants come in. Over 5,800 rooms are available within walking distance or a 5-minute shuttle ride from the theme parks. The rooms can be booked separately or as part of a holiday package. The resort also has 68 dining facilities serving a wide variety of food ranging from light snacks to fine cuisine, depending on your taste and budget. Meal vouchers can also be bought as part of a holiday package.

The package prices range from ?111 to ?244 per adult for a 2day park hopper ticket. This would include accommodation, breakfast and entry tickets to both theme parks. Entry to the parks cost between ?29 per child per day and ?93 per adult for 3 days. For a more enjoyable experience, guests are advised to book an all inclusive holiday package which covers accommodation for 3 days, park entrance, meal vouchers and transportation.

The resort is open 365 days a year and is easily accessible from all over France and Europe, thanks to the nearby Marne-la-Vallee/ Chessy train station. For guests from the UK, Eurostar provides a dedicated, affordable train service from London St Pancras International and Ashford International daily.

So, for a family adventure that's entertaining, exciting, and economical, and has something for everyone, Disneyland Resort Paris is the place to go. No wonder it's called Europe's No1 Tourist Destination!
